Self Definition Speech: Where have I been? The goal of this assignment is to help create an understanding atmosphere for the school year. To achieve this, you will present a speech on what defines who you are today. Essentially, this speech will offer the class the opportunity to learn something unique about you. Think of 2-3 areas that have had an impact on your life, for example: your family, friends, hobbies, school life, experiences etc. Telling a story is the best way to emphasize your points and to capture an audience's attention.

This assignment has a great impact on everyone in the class because it helps students understand one another. Sharing personal stories builds trust, relationships and helps transform the class into a family.

To formalize the grading, use a rubric for the speech that includes eye contact, clarity, tone, creativity, use of visual aids etc.
