

WHAT IS PLUS?

- PLUS stands for Peer Leaders Uniting Students.
- Student voice and participatory action program.
- Student-led school climate improvement.
- School climate data collection, synthesis, and dissemination.
- Forums facilitated by young people.
- Relationship and connectedness-building activities.







- Implemented in 515 schools in 13 states throughout the United States.
- A PLUS Team consists of 25-30 students that represent a cross-section of campus influencers
- Designed to be integrated into a school's master calendar.
- PLUS class is part of a regular academic day.
- Gathers quantitative and qualitative data.
- Evidence based and data driven.

PLUS engages students in identifying and addressing critical issues related to school climate. Students swill participate in Youth Participatory Action Research (YPAR) projects which includes:



EVIDENCE BASED

Employed a quasi-experimental design to examine the effects of a school-based youth participatory action research program on the education outcomes of participating high school students.

Community Development & Youth Development What is YPAR? Youth Participatory Action Research

YPAR is an innovative approach to positive youth and community development in which young people are trained to conduct systematic research to improve their lives, their communities, and the institutions intended to serve them. YPAR is a cyclical process of learning and action – research is done not just for the sake of it but to inform solutions to problems that young people themselves care about. YPAR can be useful for any young people wanting to make a difference, and is an especially powerful approach for young people who are experiencing marginalization due to racism, sexism, homophobia, transphobia, classism, ableism, or other forms of oppression.

Safe Schools Initiatives states schools need a mechanism for safe schools to be realized. The PLUS Model uses these "Gears" as our mechanism:



COLLECTING DATA: STUDENT VOICE

Quantitative

- Baseline Surveys
 - 25% or more sampling
 - Purpose is to determine what experiences students are having on campus that affect campus culture and climate.
 - Administered 3 times Beginning, Middle, End
- Monthly Surveys
 - 10% of campus One department at a time
 - Purpose to Dig Deeper or follow-up with questions relating to Baseline Survey.
- Forum Surveys
 - Drive Forum Discussion
 - Detail Specific Data

Qualitative

- Forums consist of up to 60 students
- Completely Student Facilitated
- Solutions-oriented
- Provide outlet for students to cooperate, think critically, and problem solve
- Outlet for student voice



MY NAME MY STORY

Empathy and empathetic leadership:

Empathy is the ability to get perspectives of other people with whom we share our spaces, to be able to relate with them and form strong social bonds, communicate and solve problems, resolve conflicts and establish peace, reduce bullying, reduce unconscious biases and accept diversity. While neuro-scientists have found empathy to be a biological ability which 99% humans possess, a meta analysis of studies from 1979 to 2009 has found that two critical components of empathy - emphatic concern and perspective taking - have dropped by 48% and 33% since 1979. Empathy is linked positively to productivity in workplaces in the Lady Geek 2015 Global Empathy Index. Empathy is the primary motivation for us to not lie, steal or hurt.

Social and Cross-Cultural Skills:

"The U.S. Census Bureau (2008) projects that the U.S. population will be older and more diverse by the middle of this century. Racial and ethnic minorities will comprise the majority of the nation's population by 2042,..."

The modern models of US businesses are global in scope, success of which requires sensitivity to and respect of cultural differences, acceptance of diverse ideas and values, and collaboration amidst individuals with different working styles. Moreover, a boost in productivity is highly dependent on tapping all the talent in the pool. The ability to empathize with others would strengthen the skills required to perform effectively in an ethnically, culturally, linguistically, and religiously diverse workplace.

Creativity, Innovative mindset (Design Thinking):

Innovating empathetic solutions to complex problems are dependent on nurturing the right-brain through a wide range of idea creation techniques, such as Human Centered Design Thinking.

These skills would strengthen the abilities to create new and worthwhile ideas (both incremental and radical concepts); elaborate, refine, analyze and evaluate their own ideas in order to improve and maximize creative efforts; as well as view failure as an opportunity to learn.




