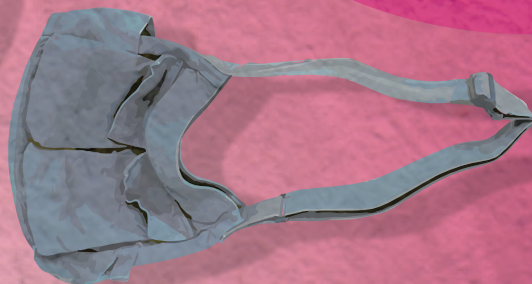

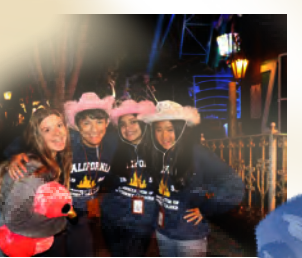

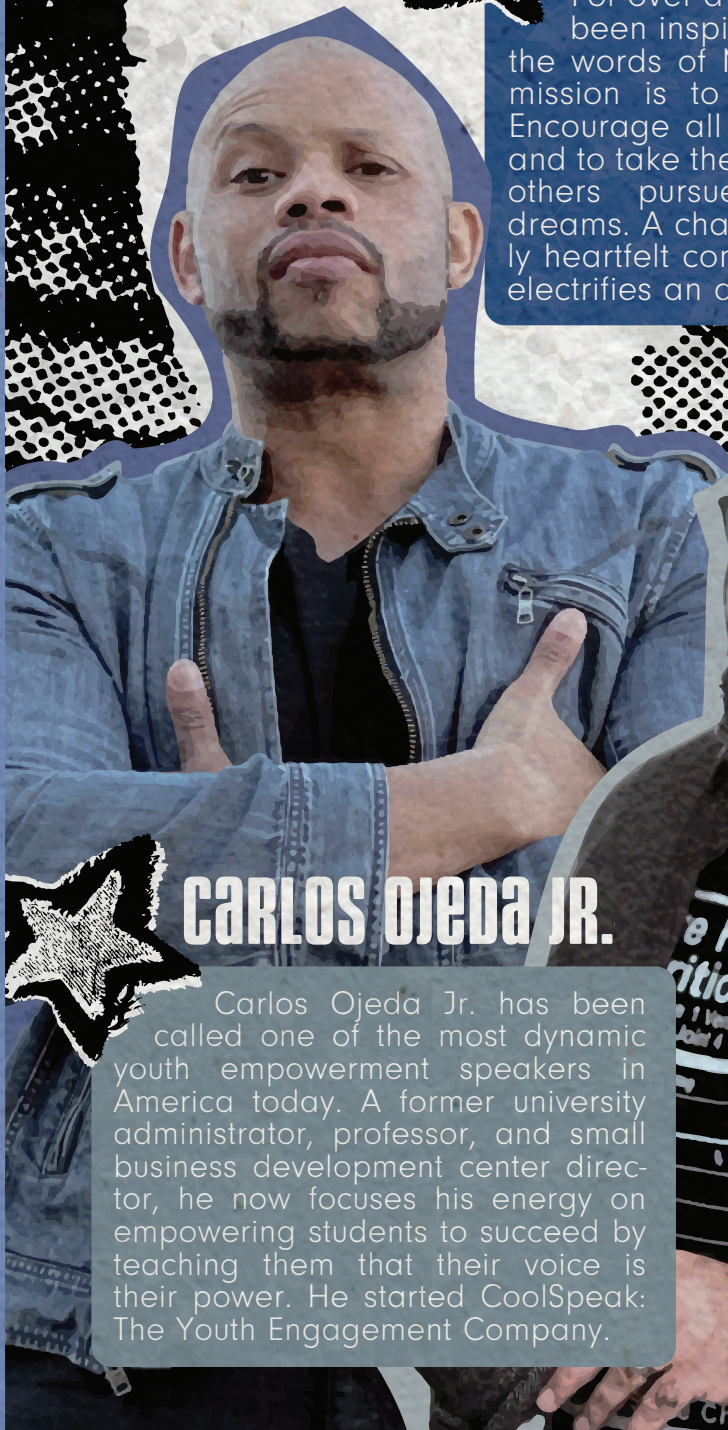
Allison is thrilled to be entering her first year as a Leadership Coach. As the daughter of a public-school teacher and a self-pro-
