CONVENTION TIPS

- Once you arrive on set, head to our convention registration, sponsored by Pegleg Entertainment. Our friendly and welcoming production crew will then direct you to visit your Area Table for information and resources that are specific to your geographic region of California. We ask you then to have your "headshot" taken for our 2020 Convention Yearbook. The whole company will be photographed, so be sure to have your photo taken so that you will be featured in this exciting convention "program."
- 2. Your Cast ID (name badge) is the most important piece of your attire during the CADA Convention. Company meetings (general sessions), production meetings (workshops), prop house (exhibit hall) and other events require your cast ID for admittance. The only exception to this is Friday night at CADA's Tribute to the Tonys. Your dinner ticket will be all you need to walk the red carpet and join us for dinner, entertainment, awards, and dancing!
- 3. Be sure to leave early to get a good seat for all of the Company Meetings (general sessions). Awards will not be given during this year's General Sessions. Instead, we will give a little more time to our speakers in order to hear their full messages. Elevator traffic can be busy before general sessions. We also suggest you look carefully at the workshops that are offered to see what best suits your needs and concerns. Arrive early, as many workshops will fill quickly. (Attending Wednesday's "How to Navigate the Convention" at 1:00 PM may help you to plan your schedule.) You'll also want to pencil in plenty of time to visit our "Prop House" (Exhibit Hall) to meet 170+ vendors who can provide you with resources to improve school climate and offer new ideas and products.

Jack Moore Award is presented annually as a lifetime achievement award, recognizing longstanding efforts on behalf of the organization in working with both student leaders and advisors as well as serving CADA statewide. The Jack Moore Award recipient is recognized during the Friday General Session and on Friday night at "CADA's Tribute to the Tonys."

Master Activity Advisor (MAA) Program Graduates - CADA members receiving the Master Activity Advisor (MAA) Certificate have successfully completed a course of study which focuses on building the best possible activities program. These highly trained and knowledgeable graduates have spent at least two years completing courses and a field study project for the betterment of their school community. This year's graduates are being recognized during the Friday General Session.

Outstanding Leadership Program Award recognizes schools in California with outstanding leadership programs that support and encompass the CADA/CASL Roadmap to Positive School Culture & Climate and CASL Mission Statement. Finalists for this year's award are recognized on the video screen at the Saturday Closing Brunch. Award recipients receive their Outstanding Leadership Program Award at the CASL State Conference.

Warren Shull Award is awarded by the National Student Council (NatStuCo) recognizing outstanding contributions in working with student leaders. CADA chooses a middle and high school designee each year to represent the state of California. The Warren Shull Award Recipients will be recognized on Friday night at "CADA's Tribute to the Tonys."



Mike grew up in a small, rural, farm town in western Nebraska: human population 2,000; cattle population 100,000 and counting. He was a kid who was into skateboarding, music, art, sports - pretty much anything that wasn't

school. But unfortunately, his small town was more than three hours away from the closest skatepark, concert venue, or arts space. Growing up where kids lacked these kinds of alternative outlets, Mike was always drawn to the idea of creating a place that impacted kids' lives. Fast forward to today and he's the co-founder of the non-profit, Rabble Mill, that's working to end generational poverty one young person at a time. His work empowers kids to discover their passion and build life and professional skills through the very things Mike grew up loving: skateboarding, music, and art. One of Mike's biggest passions is to get kids to stop talking and wishing and start learning how to actually do what they love. To do this, Mike and his friends have launched a career and lifestyle education platform called Find Your Grind (FYG) that exposes students and teachers to ever-emerging career possibilities. FYG's mission is simple: to curate and help navigate the 21st Century roadmap, enabling people to discover who they are, where they're going, and the first steps to get there. Join us as Mike shares his uplifting stories and a powerful message of the power of perseverance, tenacity, and grit!



3rd General Session – Erin Gruwell 1:00 PM – 2:45 PM | Silver State Pavilion

In this session we will explore the impact that creativity has upon a school's culture by hearing from our friend, the legendary Erin Gruwell. When Erin started college she expected to become a lawyer; however, following the Rodney King verdict and the subsequent LA Riots, she realized that her place was not in a courtroom, but a classroom. After finishing school, Ms. Gruwell began teaching at Woodrow Wilson

High School in Long Beach, CA. Her students were considered some of the worst students in Los Angeles, and the educational system had all but forgotten about them. Despite school administrators and other staff doubting that these students would ever achieve anything, Erin pressed on, believing that any child can succeed.

After intercepting a racist caricature depicting one of her students, Gruwell told her students that it was drawings like that which led to the Holocaust. When one of her students asked her, "What was the Holocaust?" she was met by uncomprehending looks – none of her students had heard of one of the defining moments of the 20th century. So

she rebooted her entire curriculum, using treasured books like Anne Frank's diary as her guide, to combat intolerance and misunderstanding. Her students began recording their thoughts and feelings in their own diaries, eventually dubbing themselves the "Freedom Writers." Their stories became the Freedom Writers' Diary, which quickly climbed to the top of the New York Bestsellers list.

Erin Gruwell continues to fight for equality in education and inspires teachers and students all over the world with her work. Ms. Gruwell and her students' story became the basis for the 2007 feature film, Freedom Writers, and the documentary, Freedom Writers: Stories from the Heart, which aired nationally on PBS in 2019. In September of 2019, the Freedom Writers Diary was republished with twenty new stories to celebrate the book's twentieth anniversary. We welcome Ms. Gruwell to the CADA stage and admire the creativity she used to transform lives and change the trajectory of her students' futures. 


