three councils for similar reasons.





Executive Council

- Main decision making council of students; advised by Activities Director and ASB Financial Bookkeeper
 - Consists of ELECTED OFFICERS:
 - ASB President
 - ASB Vice President
 - ASB Secretary
 - ASB Treasurer
 - And APPOINTED COMMISSIONERS: *
 - Student Board Representative
 - Community Service Commissioner
 - Multi-Media Commissioner
 - Public Relations Commissioner
 - Fundraising Commissioner
 - Events Commissioner
 - Recognition Commissioner
- *positions vary on a yearly basis to meet mission of elected officers

Executive Council

- All members are required to attend a summer retreat to develop a Mission Statement to guide all decisions and student activities for the year.
- The council meets weekly on Monday mornings to execute official ASB Business
(for example: approve club constitutions and projected budgets, collect club dues, oversee club adherence to fiscal and organizational guidelines, maintain common supplies, oversee expenditures that benefit entire student body, approve concessions and fundraisers, approve action of senate and presidents council when necessary)
- All members are enrolled and are active members in the 0 period Student Leadership Class that administers the majority of student activities.
- The council selects teams of qualified applicants from the student body to be additional members of the Student Leadership Class

Executive Council

- All members are intimately involved in the administration and decisions related to the business of the Student Store.
- All members are required to work the Point of Sale Counter at least one day a week during their lunch and have specific knowledge of all business conducted in the student store.

Presidents Council

- Facilitated by the Executive Council's Student Board Representative
- Advised by ASB Bookkeeper and rotating Administrator
- Consists of PRESIDENTS OF ALL APPROVED CAMPUS CLUBS
- Membership (and attendance) is required for active club status as stipulated in the ASB Constitution

Presidents Council

- Members (prospective presidents in some cases) are required to attend a two-hour training session within the first four weeks of the school year. Topics covered in the training include:
 - Constitutions
 - Projected budgets/ Fiscal responsibility
 - Fundraising forms
 - Purchasing procedures
 - Club Reports
 - Robert's Rules of Order
 - Meeting Minutes
 - Leadership
- Regular meetings are monthly during lunch to share club reports and information and as a general forum for questions and support
- Club Reports are compiled into a monthly "Club News" report that is distributed through the student senate, monthly school newsletter and to the school board.

- Advised by Activities Director and rotating administrator
- Consists of 1ST PERIOD CLASS REPRESENTATIVES
- Senators required to attend a two-hour training session within the first two weeks of the school year. Topics covered in the training include:
 - Note taking
 - Class presentations
 - Leadership
 - Event information Access
 - Student Concern Procedures
 - Committee formation as necessary based on student concerns

Student Senate

- Regular meetings are monthly during lunch to discuss student events and activities (including “Club News”), report out on student concerns, assign committees to address student concerns and as a forum for feedback and advice for the Executive Council.
- Examples of ad hoc committees: WASC, Senate Student of the Month, Campus Clean-Up, Common Area Reconfiguration, Outdoor Student Seating, Cafeteria Food Tasting/ Consultation
- We often invite guest speakers from the site (cafeteria manager, custodians, grounds), district (facilities manager, superintendent, food services administrator) and school board to listen to student concerns, or at their request to elicit student feedback.
