Campaign Rules Summary

- For posters, all candidates may use the butcher paper from the ASB office. You may not use ASB paints, tape, or any other supplies. [Feel free to come in to pick up butcher paper at brunch, lunch, or after school].
- Voting will take place on Election Day during brunch and lunch only. All students are required to present a current student ID card in order to vote. Please note: To make the process more efficient for everyone, only juniors will be allowed to vote at brunch. All eligible classes may vote at lunch. [When campaigning, you may want to remind voters that if they lost their ID card, the last day to get a replacement is this Wednesday. No ID card, no ballot, no exceptions.]
- Candidates are to inform their campaign workers that <u>posters and tape are</u> not be placed on painted or glass surfaces such as doors, windows, or campus <u>signs</u>. [It's OK to stick tape to painted stucco, but that's really the only painted surface I allow. NO tape or adhesives on trash cans, lockers, doors, picnic benches, windows, or similar surfaces. When removed, the adhesive makes an ugly mess].
- Signs may not be posted higher than 10 feet. [What this basically means is that if you can't reach it with a standard six-foot ladder placed safely on the ground, you can't post it.]
- Do not tape posters on sidewalks and walkways. Do not use chalk, adhesive stickers, or any other permanent or hard-to-remove media on walls, railings, or walkways. Do not fasten or adhere signs to trees or bushes.
- Any violation of campaign rules will result in a warning. Further violation will result in forfeiture of candidacy.
- There is no campaigning within the library, or in the "Library Zone" on Election Day. The "Library Zone" is defined as the area between the main library door, the small steps leading to the Outdoor Stage, and the steps leading down to the student store area. All campaign material within this area will be removed on Election Day.
- It is every candidate's responsibility to remove all campaign materials by 3:30 p.m. on Election Day. If the campus is still not SPOTLESS by 5:00 p.m., Mr. Ippolito will go home, wait for the candidates to finish over the weekend, and announce results on Monday. Keep in mind that he will already know the results and will have a relaxing and worry-free weekend while waiting for the campus to be cleaned.
